

# **Mental Health Services Act Report**

## **07/02/10**

### **Community Services and Supports (CSS)-**

Annual Plan Update and Annual Progress Report for FY 08/09 sent to the State on 6/9/10. PEI portion is approved and CSS portion is pending.

Michael has taken the following action on the six submitted proposals:

1. Approved moving forward with the Sierra Family Medical Clinic proposal for a sum of \$15,000. The target start date is July 1, 2010.
2. Approved funding the Welcome Home Vets program at \$15,000. The target start date is October 1, 2010. Welcome Home Vets is going to submit a counter proposal for \$45,000 (\$15,000 for 3 years) and not ask for additional funding for 3 years. We have not received the counter proposal yet.
3. Supports funding CoRR at \$15,000, but is waiting on proposal to move forward. The proposal needs to be shared with the CSS Subcommittee and the MHSA Steering Committee. Michael would like to have a start date of October 1, 2010.
4. Per the suggestion at the last Mental Health Board meeting Michael supports looking at existing programs to support the Department of Rehab proposal. Michele Violett and Glen Harelson are meeting on 7/9/10 to start this process. The idea is to expand the contracted target population that Sierra Family Services provides services to. They have been under using the funds allotted to them to date.
5. Michael supports all the work that SPIRIT is doing, but is unable to expand their funding at this time.
6. Michael is not able to fund the Innovative Board and Care Proposal. There is a question of need once the Catherin Lane house opens.

### **Housing-**

Housing loan application sent to the State on June 3, 2010 is being reviewed by the Senior Loan Committee in the middle of this month, either July 12<sup>th</sup> or 19<sup>th</sup>.

Nevada County Continuum of Care (CoC) to End Homelessness has merged with Placer CoC. We are working to merge or Homeless Management Information Systems (HMIS). Nevada County was able to purchase a web based system with Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Grant. Placer County is using two different systems, one of which was a home grown system.

### **Workforce Education and Training (WET)-**

The WET Subcommittee is moving forward with planning on co-occurring disorder training.

### **Capital Facility (CF)**

The Odyssey House remodel plan was reviewed by the State on June 15<sup>th</sup> and Martin and Michele Violett answered their questions and concerns on June 28<sup>th</sup>. The State is moving forward to approve our plan.

### **Information Technology (IT)**

Implementation planning is still occurring. A core of staff members is meeting weekly working on this project. The expected go live date is January 1, 2011.

### **Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)-**

Programs to be implemented: Columbia Teen Screening, First Responder Training, Functional Family Therapy, and Second Step

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Suicide Prevention, Senior Outreach, Dial 2-1-1, Homeless Outreach, Physician Training, Latino Outreach programs and mentoring programs are up and running.

### **Innovations-**

PowerPoint for Innovation Community Planning Meetings has been created and is being translated into Spanish. Once received training dates will be set up.
