Annual MHSA Three-Year Plan and Progress Report

The guidelines have been released. We need to have our Plan and Progress Report to the public by March 1, 2011. A request of needed information has been provided to Behavioral Health staff and service providers. Michele Violett is working on having the Annual 3-Year Plan done for the MHSA Steering Committee on 2/24/11.

Community Services and Supports (CSS)-

CoRR Co-occurring Disorder (COD) proposal for \$15,000: Behavioral Health staff are still working on the statement of works portion of the CoRR COD Contract. They are working on specific details.

Housing-

Nevada County Housing Development Corporation (NCHDC) is actively looking for housing. Mary Lowe is working on the final MOU to finalize the responsibility and relationship between the two organizations pertaining to Winters' Haven Housing Project.

Workforce Education and Training (WET)-

Capital Facility (CF)

The Odyssey House remodel plan was approved by the State. Odyssey House and the County Facility Management Department have finalized the remodel plans and the remodel is occurring.

Information Technology (IT)-No change

The Kings View contract was approved by the Board of Supervisors last month. The Behavioral Health Department is currently contracting with Kings View to help with the system setup. Behavioral Health and Kings View started meeting this week. They have moved the expected go live date to July 1, 2011.

Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)-

Michele Violett and Becky Slade are working with Tahoe Truckee Unified School District on contracts to implement the Second Step Program in Eastern Nevada County. We anticipate a startup date in Truckee of 3/1/11. Becky Slade is working with the Nevada County Superintendent of Schools to implement in Western Nevada County.

Homeless Outreach contract with Hospitality House is being renewed. Their current contract ends 2/28/11. The new contract will begin on 3/1/11 and go to 6/30/12.

Lael Walz and the Forensic Task Force are taking the lead to implement the First Responder Training program. They are looking at using the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training curriculum. They are in contact with Will Pickens, a retired Deputy with the San Mateo Sheriff's Office who is an experienced CIT Instructor and has provided CIT trainings to a number of counties, including Fresno, San Mateo, and El Dorado.

Programs to be implemented: Columbia Teen Screening and Functional Family Therapy.

Programs under contract: Suicide Prevention, Senior Outreach, Dial 2-1-1, Homeless Outreach, Physician Training, Latino Outreach, Forensic Outreach, and mentoring programs.

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Innovations-

An Innovation Review Team of 12 community members, contract providers and County staff have received 15 Innovation proposals. The Innovation review Team is making a recommendation to fund two proposals by themselves, Veterans' Family Wellness and Rehabilitation and Behavioral Health Collaborative. Additionally, they are making a recommendation to combine a number of proposals together to make one Integrated Health Care Proposal. The proposals that will be combined will be Navigator, Reducing Isolation by Building Community, Teen and Young Adult Study, and Integrated Healthcare proposals. Michael has requested that Neal Adams write this new combined proposal.

Innovation Community Planning Funds will be used to fund continued community planning of the Integrated Healthcare Proposal and the Teen and Young Adult Study. We have \$99,600 of Community Planning Funds. Some of these funds have been expended to conduct the 11 community meetings we held. Lastly, these funds will also be used to write the plans.
