

Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Report

Mental Health Board Meeting Date: 10/5/18

1. SB 1004:

- a. Approved by Governor Brown and will take effect in 2020 but it is unclear how or if our regulations will change at this time.
- b. Categories are:
 - (1) Childhood trauma prevention and early intervention to deal with the early origins of mental health needs.
 - (2) Early psychosis and mood disorder detection and intervention, and mood disorder and suicide prevention programming that occurs across the lifespan.
 - (3) Youth outreach and engagement strategies that target secondary school and transition age youth, with a priority on partnership with college mental health programs.
 - (4) Culturally competent and linguistically appropriate prevention and intervention.
 - (5) Strategies targeting the mental health needs of older adults.
 - (6) Other programs the commission identifies, with stakeholder participation, that are proven effective in achieving, and are reflective of, the goals stated in Section 5840.

2. Innovation Update: continued focus on homelessness; must spend AB 114 by June 30, 2020. Hoping to hold community stakeholder meetings within the next few months.

3. No Place Like Home (NPLH):

- a. RFP is open through October 12th
- b. Thurmond Consulting working on update of plan to address homelessness, which is needed to apply for NPLH
- c. **Xxx** applicants

4. MHSA Plan Update 18/19: attempting to simplify, executive summary for an easier read, likely minimal changes (usually larger changes to plan occur during the 3-year updates)
